Application for FFIPP Summer Program 2017

FFIPP – Educational Network for Human Rights in Palestine/Israel is a student-led association aiming to raise awareness internationally about the situation in Palestine/Israel. FFIPP's position is anchored in international law, which principally means that we condemn the occupation and support justice in the region.

During the summer program, you will have the opportunity to participate in an **orientation week**, which consists of meeting various actors and attending conferences in Israel and the West Bank, and subsequently to **intern at one of our partner organizations**. These internships are above all an opportunity to observe, to have a better understanding of the situation on the ground and to discover local structures acting towards the promotion of human rights. This summer programme is very different from any other programme you may apply to, because of the unique experience every participant will have.

Accommodation throughout the entire stay will be paid for as well as certain meals during the orientation week. You will have to pay for your flights, personal expenses and a contribution that could go up to 100€.

As an international student network, we give you the opportunity to go to Palestine/Israel for five weeks and stay involved in our organization for the coming year. Back in Europe, FFIPP organizes events, exhibitions, and conferences to raise awareness about the conflict at the local level. As such, **selected students have a one-year commitment towards the FFIPP following the summer program**: they have to remain participating members, organise events raising awareness within the local chapter and at the European level help raise funds. It is important to understand that FFIPP provides a year experience at the beginning of which you go in Palestine-Israel during five weeks, rather than a simple internship.

The form below is the first step of your application; the second step will be oral interviews with pre-selected applicants. Please fill this form in English (no more than 200 words per answer) and return it **with a CV** to the email of your local chapter before the **4th of March (by midnight)**.
